



Dwight MacAulay CVO Second Vice President

Dwight MacAulay is the recently retired Chief of Protocol for the Government of Manitoba and he also served as the Chief of Protocol for the Government of South Australia from 2006-08.

A native of Dunrea and Killarney, Manitoba he followed a career in radio and television broadcasting before joining the Manitoba Government in 1980.

As Chief of Protocol he organized several Royal visits and also played a key organizational role on several international trade missions to such nations as the United States, China, Philippines, India, Iceland, France, England, Belgium and Australia.

Dwight was twice honoured by Her Majesty The Queen. In 2002 he received the Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order (LVO) and in 2010 was elevated to the level of Commander of the Royal Victoria Order (CVO) and to this day, remains the only Manitoban to ever be so honoured.

A committed volunteer, he currently serves on the Order of Manitoba Advisory Council, and the boards of The Saint Andrew's Society of Winnipeg, The International Peace Garden, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, The Manitoba Museum, St. John's Ambulance, the Intrepid Society and the Royal Commonwealth Society. In addition Dwight has been a presiding official for Canadian Citizenship Ceremonies and currently serves on the Judicial Advisory Committee for Manitoba.

He was also recently appointed as Britain's Honorary Consul for the province.
